#### **Leave No Trace/Outdoor Ethics:**

- Tie in with nature theme
- Each patrol has a scout from a leave no trace person (Leave No Trace Trainer patch from BSA supply).
   Sole responsibility to keep their patrol focused on Leave No Trace.

Note: Official BSA seems to say that a BSA Trainer must be 14 or older and officially trained. Scouts with this position who have not yet been trained can be listed as Instructors.
